
“Wilderness times”




Luke 3:4 and 4:1

- A voice of one calling in the wilderness – prepare the way for the Lord, make straight paths for him
- Let's take a moment to reflect on this verse. Have we stopped to really listen to God's voice? What can we do to prepare his way and make a straight path?
- Jesus was led by the Spirit into the wilderness
- Jesus was led into the wilderness by the Holy Spirit where he was alone for forty days and nights. Are we experiencing just a little of that isolation at the moment? Was Jesus led willingly and are we?
